01 THEOLOGICAL TRAINING AND DISCIPLESHIP: Equipping Students and Leaders for Gospel Impact

SHEPHERD'S ACADEMY UPDATE CALVARY CHAPEL BIBLE COLLEGE

By God's grace, **Shepherd's Academy** has continued to grow both academically and spiritually. Students successfully completed their lessons and sat for their exams, closing the term with great diligence. The half-term break gave them a much-needed opportunity to rest, reflect, and return with renewed commitment to their studies.

Beyond academics, we are encouraged by the spiritual growth we are witnessing. Participation in tutorials, assignments, and discussions revealed a genuine hunger for God's Word and a desire to apply it practically in life and ministry. We remain prayerful that the seeds being sown will bear lasting fruit in years to come.

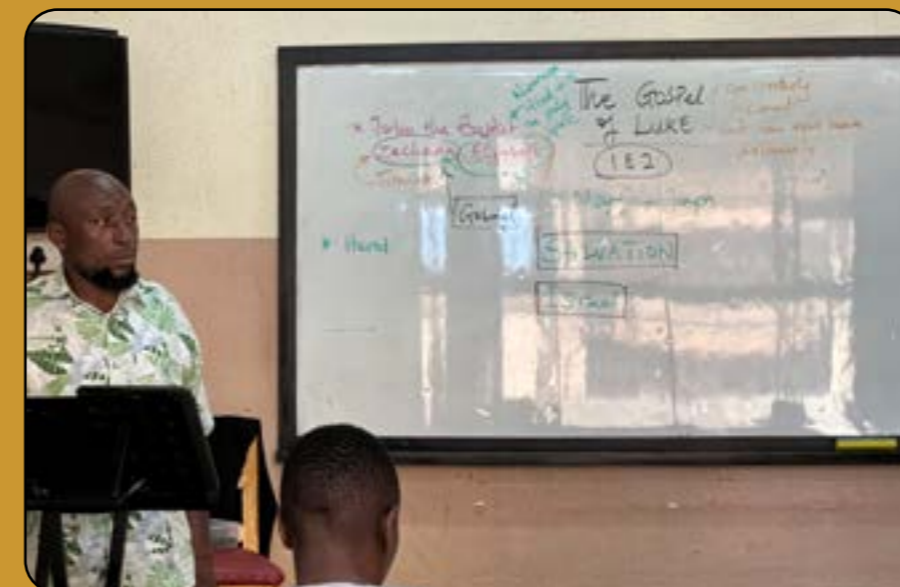
The past three months at Calvary Chapel Bible College have been refreshing and transformative. The restart of classes this year has brought renewed energy, with students engaging deeply in biblically rich sessions that are shaping both their knowledge and character.

Discussions have been vibrant, filled with thoughtful questions and an eagerness to grow in faith. It is clear that God is not only increasing their understanding of Scripture but also molding them into leaders marked by humility, faithfulness, and vision.

OUTREACH MISSION IN KAABONG: The Gospel in Context

As part of our quarterly theological training efforts, in partnership with Shepherd's Academy and Frontier Missions, our team traveled to Kaabong District in Karamoja to conduct a pastoral training. The focus was on Church History and the Gospel in Context, equipping local pastors and leaders with a deeper understanding of the Church's origin, purpose, and mission.

Over two days, we explored foundational questions such as: What is the Church? Who leads it? What is its mission? We also traced the journey of Christianity from Jerusalem to Karamoja—highlighting how history, politics, culture, and language shape the way the Gospel is received and lived out in this region, with particular focus on the Ik people of Lotim. This was not simply an academic exercise, but a practical equipping session that addressed the unique challenges leaders face in proclaiming Christ within their cultural context. It reflects our broader vision: to multiply sound, contextualized theological training across Uganda through strategic partnerships and consistent quarterly engagements.



02 SCHOOLS MINISTRY UPDATE

As part of our ongoing commitment to schools ministry this quarter, we had the privilege of engaging with thousands of students across different regions of Uganda. These visits reaffirmed what we deeply believe at Tru Tangazo — young people are hungry for truth, eager to ask real questions, and open to the hope of the Gospel when given the opportunity.



NDEJJE SENIOR SECONDARY SCHOOL Over 3,000 Students Reached

We were invited back to Ndejje S.S.S. for a full day of ministry, where we preached in three consecutive services — first to the A-Level students, then to S3 & S4, and finally to S1 & S2. Each service drew over 1,000 learners, reaching more than 3,000 students in total.

The sessions were dynamic, with students asking spontaneous questions between services and engaging deeply during a dedicated Q&A session in the afternoon. Many continued the conversation privately afterward, some even seeking counsel in the Chaplain's office. We thank God that the dialogue is ongoing, with students following up afterward for more guidance. Encouraged by this impact, the Chaplain has already expressed interest in hosting us again — with even more time set aside for teaching and discussion.

MINISTRY IN MOROTO

A Gospel Encounter of Questions, Healing, and Hope

Our team also traveled to Karamoja for ministry in Moroto District, visiting two schools:

1. Moroto High School: Students welcomed the Gospel with curiosity and bold questions, demonstrating their eagerness to understand the relevance of faith in daily life.
2. St. Andrew's Lotome S.S.: Here we witnessed powerful responses to the Gospel, including public declarations of faith. One particularly moving moment came when a Senior 3 girl struggling with suicidal thoughts sought counseling and prayer, experiencing hope through Christ. The Q&A session was equally impactful, with students raising profound questions on prayer, suffering, hearing God's voice, and coping with broken family situations.

In both schools, we saw the Gospel touch lives in transformative ways from healing brokenness to sparking bold declarations of faith.



04 PARTNERSHIPS

WITH UGANDA CHRISTIAN LAWYERS FRATERNITY (UCLF)

This quarter, we were blessed with the opportunity to strengthen our relationship with the Uganda Christian Lawyers Fraternity (UCLF). Our discussions have focused on exploring practical ways to reach and disciple law students and young legal professionals, equipping them to integrate their Christian faith with their studies and future practice.



We are especially excited about a major milestone just ahead: on October 4th, we will participate in the Annual Law Students' Retreat. This retreat brings together law students from across Uganda for holistic growth—academically, professionally, and spiritually. Our role will be to share on the integration of faith and law, inspiring students to pursue justice with integrity and biblical conviction. This event marks a significant step forward in our collaboration with UCLF, and we are prayerfully expectant for the impact it will have.

Looking into the coming months, we are preparing to join UCLF in other key initiatives, including:

1. Integrity Campaign in Iganga – Restoring trust in the legal profession by promoting honesty and ethics as guiding principles.
2. "Hope for Justice in View of the Cross" Symposium – Providing law students with a platform to reflect on the state of justice in Uganda, while rooting their hope in Christ's redemptive work.

PARTNERSHIP WITH SCRIPTURE UNION UGANDA

This quarter also marked the beginning of a promising partnership with Scripture Union Uganda. We met with their leadership to explore areas of collaboration, particularly in reaching students through camps and leadership training. To guide this relationship, we are drafting a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that will provide a clear framework for partnership and maximize our impact together.

As part of this collaboration, we were invited to engage with Scripture Union leaders at Ndejje Secondary School. On Sunday, 23rd August, our team led an interactive Q&A session with student leaders on biblical leadership, addressing questions like: How do I know I am a leader? and What makes a good leader? Their hunger for clarity and growth was evident.

Later, on Tuesday, 26th August, Rev. delivered a powerful message during the leaders' morning session, followed by another honest Q&A time where students wrestled with deeper questions about the Christian faith and discipleship.

MEDIA AND ONLINE ENGAGEMENT

This quarter, we were intentional about investing in our digital presence, and by God's grace, we have made significant progress. We managed to shoot and produce a number of videos, giving us a solid library of content that will sustain our platforms for quite some time. This consistency is already bearing fruit as we expand our reach and visibility.

One of the most exciting developments has been the launch of a short video series designed to address the real questions we often encounter during our school engagements. These videos aim to make biblical responses to life's toughest issues accessible to young people and the wider public. Over the past months, we released thought-provoking episodes such as:

- [Struggling with Faith After Losing a Loved One](#) – on navigating grief while holding on to faith.
- [Why Did Jesus Choose Only Men as His Disciples?](#) – exploring gender and discipleship in the ministry of Jesus.
- [Does Christian Life and Worship Reflect Witchcraft?](#) – examining the dangers of syncretism in our faith practices.
- [Why Do Bad Things Happen to Good People?](#) – addressing suffering and the goodness of God.

Through these videos, we have been able to connect with a growing online audience—including many who may never step into our in-person sessions. This growth is especially encouraging for us, as building an engaged digital community not only amplifies our message now but also lays the foundation for greater visibility and long-term impact.

Beyond videos, we have been consistent in updating and engaging across our social media platforms. This has helped us to both create awareness about our ongoing work and foster a stronger sense of community among our followers. We are greatly encouraged by the increasing levels of engagement and are committed to stewarding these digital tools as vital avenues for ministry, discipleship, and impact.



CLOSING REFLECTIONS

As we look back on this quarter, we are deeply grateful for the faithfulness of God, the dedication of our team, and the incredible opportunities He has provided to serve, disciple, and equip leaders across Uganda.
