MINISTRY SUMMARY

This season was characterized by sustained teaching, discipleship, media engagement, and public theological dialogue. Across schools, conferences, media platforms, and mentorship spaces, our focus remained on equipping believers with a biblically grounded worldview, strengthening families, and engaging key questions of faith and society while faithfully proclaiming Christ.

- **Family Life and Personal Milestones**

This quarter included both grief and joy within our community. We mourned the passing of Lynn's father, and also celebrated the gift of life with the birth of baby Amara in the Muhima family. These moments deepened our reflection on the fragility of life, the blessing of new beginnings, and God's sustaining grace in all seasons.

- **Political and Economic Context**

The quarter was shaped by ongoing global political tensions, particularly the Iran-Israel-USA conflict dynamics, which contributed to economic instability and rising fuel prices. These developments have continued to impact transport costs, commodity prices, and household livelihoods, underscoring the need for wisdom and resilience.

Theological Reflection - Malachi 4:6

Our guiding reflection for the quarter has been

Malachi 4:6:

"And he will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers, lest I come and strike the land with a decree of utter destruction."

This scripture has served as a key lens for our ministry this quarter, highlighting God's heart for restored relationships across generations. It has shaped our emphasis on reconciliation, healing of fractured family bonds, and the restoration of intergenerational unity as central to God's redemptive work.

SCHOOL OUTREACHES AND STUDENT MINISTRY

During the quarter, we continued investing in the spiritual formation of children and young people through a series of school outreaches, **apologetics engagements**, and **discipleship opportunities**.

These engagements provided valuable platforms to proclaim the gospel, equip students to think biblically, and respond to the real questions and challenges they face in their daily lives.

Ndejje Senior Secondary School – Easter Mission and Outreach

We were once again privileged to partner with like-minded ministries—including **Jesus Legacy, Ufahari Girls, and The Message Trust**—for the annual Easter Mission at Ndejje Senior Secondary School.

Throughout the Easter weekend, we ministered to the students through a variety of activities centred on the message of Christ's death and resurrection. The programme included the symbolic foot-washing service for, three Easter worship services with the celebration of Holy Communion, interactive Bible teaching sessions, and an open Question and Answer panel held on Easter Sunday afternoon.

The **Q&A session** provided students with a safe environment to ask honest questions about the Christian faith, while the worship services encouraged deeper reflection on the significance of the cross and the hope found in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Together with our ministry partners, we were grateful for the opportunity to serve the school community and help students engage more deeply with the gospel during one of the most significant seasons of the Christian calendar.

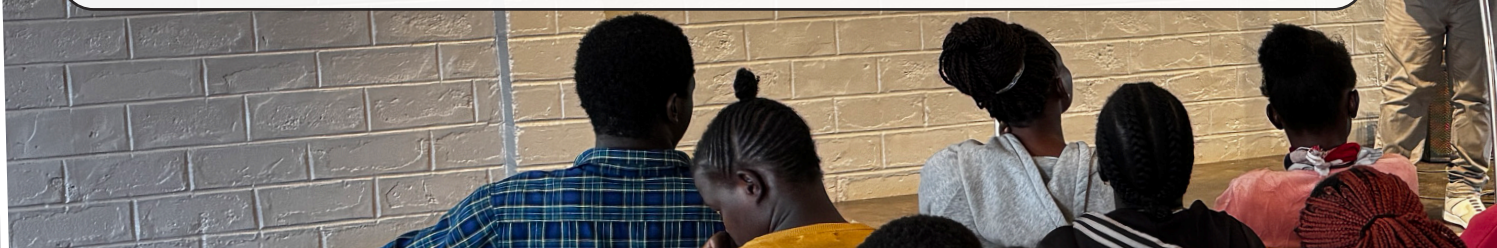


Watoto Schools – Apologetics Sessions

Our Team Leader facilitated several **apologetics sessions with Watoto teenagers and young adults**, engaging hundreds of students in thoughtful conversations about the Christian faith. These highly interactive sessions created space for young people to ask difficult and often deeply personal questions about Christianity. Topics included the existence of God, relationships, sexual purity, prayer and miracles, the reality of evil and the devil, forgiveness, and the reliability of the Christian faith.

One of the recurring themes across the sessions was **the problem of suffering** particularly the question of why a loving and sovereign God allows pain and suffering, especially in the lives of good people. This question resonated not only with the students but also with the Watoto mothers who faithfully care for the children in the Watoto villages. The discussions provided an opportunity to explore biblical answers with compassion, helping participants understand suffering through the lens of God's character, His redemptive purposes, and the hope found in Christ.

These sessions continue to demonstrate the growing need among young people for thoughtful, biblically grounded responses to the questions they encounter in their personal lives and in the wider culture.



SHOMA Christian Academy

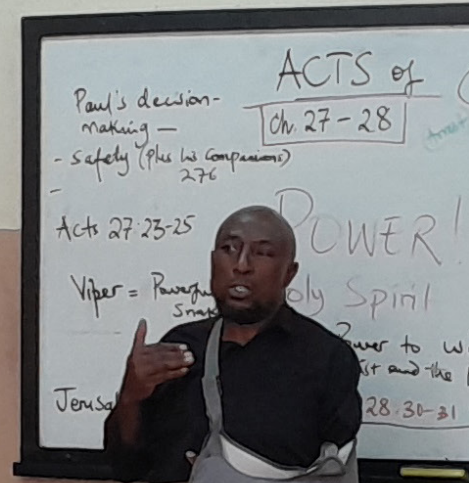
Our Team Leader had the opportunity to speak during the school assembly at **SHOMA Christian Academy**, where he encouraged students to pursue both academic excellence and spiritual maturity.

Drawing from **biblical principles**, he challenged the students to cultivate **godly character, faithfully steward** the opportunities God has given them, and remain firmly rooted in Christ as they navigate the various pressures and decisions of school life. The assembly provided an opportunity to encourage the entire student body to see their education as part of God's calling and to live as faithful witnesses both inside and outside the classroom.

We remain grateful for the doors God continues to open in **schools and educational institutions**. These engagements allow us to invest in the next generation by helping young people develop a biblical worldview, grow in confidence in the Christian faith, and become faithful disciples who are equipped to influence their communities for Christ.



PASTORAL TRAINING



One of our key focus areas is the training and equipping of pastors and Christian leaders. Through this work, we are investing in the future of the Church by preparing faithful men and women at the grassroots level who can effectively teach, disciple, and shepherd others within their own communities. Our goal is to strengthen local churches by multiplying biblically grounded leaders who are equipped to faithfully proclaim God's Word where we may not be physically present. Some of the ways we do it is in the following:

Calvary Chapel Bible College

This quarter, we continued teaching at Calvary Chapel Bible College and successfully concluded the semester last month. The courses taught included Acts of the Apostles and Spiritual Leadership.

In the Spiritual Leadership course, students explored the distinctives of Christian leadership and how it differs from secular models of leadership. Through the lives of biblical figures such as Moses, David, Saul, and Jonathan, as well as leadership examples from the New Testament, students examined how Christ Himself provides the ultimate model for Christian leadership.

The study of the Book of Acts emphasized its foundational importance for both Christian faith and practice. Many believers have never undertaken a systematic study of Acts, yet it is essential for understanding the birth of the Church, the spread of the gospel, and the lives of the first Christians. The course challenged students to see Acts not merely as history but as a guide for faithful Christian witness and ministry today.

The Shepherds Academy (TSA)

Our ongoing cohort of seven students continued their studies during the quarter, completing four course units:

- **Public Theology**
- **Worship and the Psalms**
- **Christian Media and Communication**
- **The Second Epistle of Peter (2 Peter)**

Each course made a valuable contribution to the students' theological formation, several stood out for their profound impact.

The Public Theology course challenged students to recognize that theology is not merely an academic discipline or something confined to the church. Rather, it is intended to shape every aspect of a believer's engagement with the public sphere, equipping Christians to think and live biblically in society.

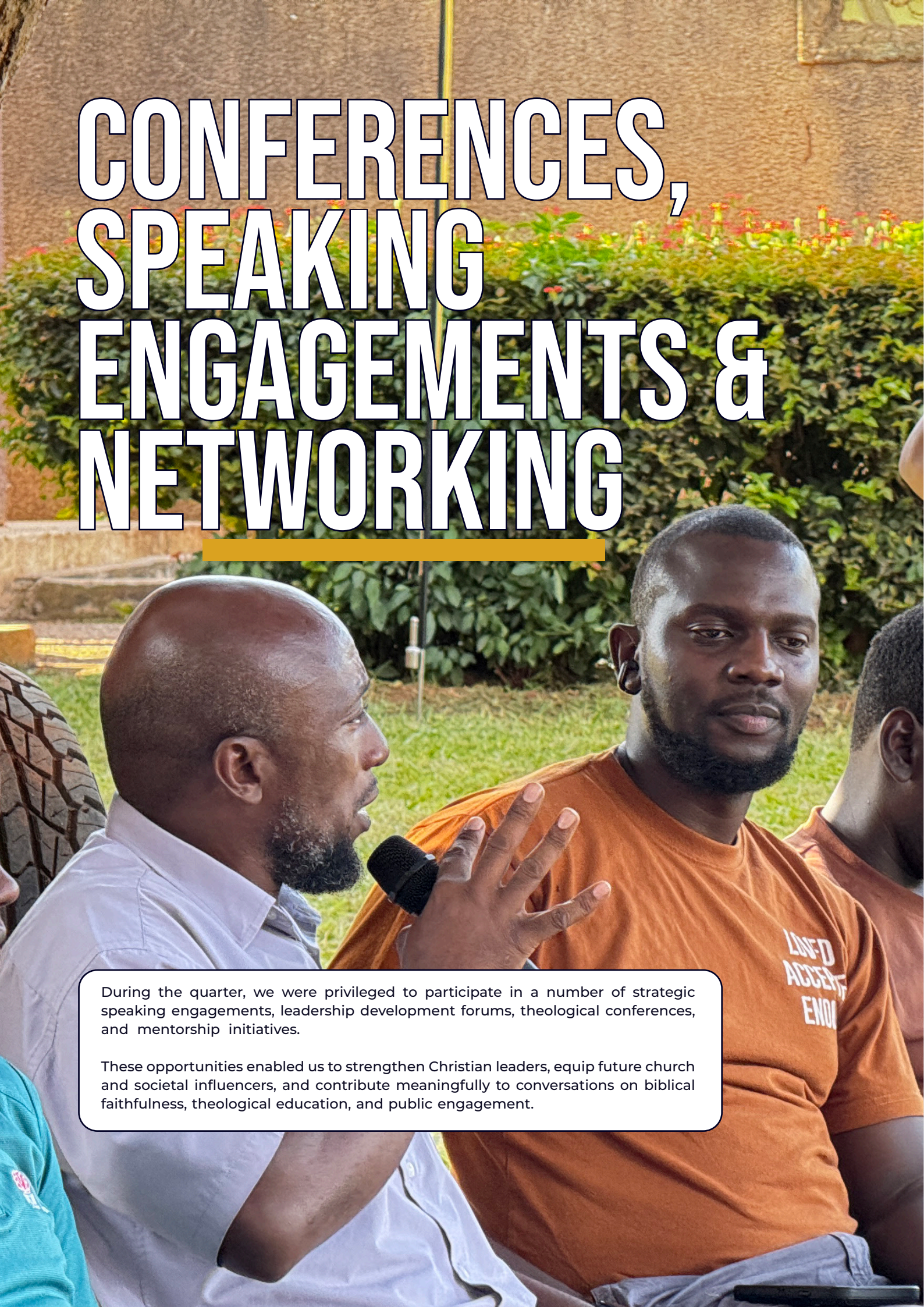
The Worship and the Psalms course deepened students' understanding of biblical worship, demonstrating that worship extends far beyond music and singing. Students were encouraged to see worship as a life of wholehearted devotion and joyful obedience to God.

The Christian Media and Communication course equipped students to engage thoughtfully with today's media landscape, exploring how Christians can use various communication platforms to faithfully proclaim the gospel and communicate biblical truth with wisdom and integrity.

Finally, the study of 2 Peter encouraged students to pursue spiritual maturity, remain grounded in sound doctrine, and faithfully guard the truth of the gospel in the face of false teaching.

The semester was enriching as a whole, these course units proved especially transformative. Many students testified that they reshaped their understanding of the Christian life and ministry, challenged long-held assumptions, and equipped them to serve the Church with greater biblical conviction and confidence.

CONFERENCES, SPEAKING ENGAGEMENTS & NETWORKING



During the quarter, we were privileged to participate in a number of strategic speaking engagements, leadership development forums, theological conferences, and mentorship initiatives.

These opportunities enabled us to strengthen Christian leaders, equip future church and societal influencers, and contribute meaningfully to conversations on biblical faithfulness, theological education, and public engagement.

Fathers' Day Feast

As part of our ongoing ministry to men and fathers in partnership with the Dad Base, we hosted our annual Father's Day Feast, creating space for honest reflection on the challenges, disappointments, and emotional burdens many fathers carry throughout their parenting journey. Our Team Leader delivered a message exploring the effects of the Fall on fatherhood and the redemptive and restorative work accomplished through Jesus Christ, demonstrating how the gospel offers hope, healing, forgiveness, and renewal for fathers and families.

One of the most significant moments of the gathering was a reflective letter-writing exercise. Every participant wrote two personal letters: the first addressed to God as a prayer of gratitude, confession, and dependence, and the second addressed to their earthly father—whether living or deceased. While the letters to God flowed naturally as prayers, many found writing to their fathers to be emotionally challenging, exposing long-held wounds, disappointments, gratitude, forgiveness, and unresolved relationships. Several participants courageously volunteered to read portions of their letters aloud, creating an atmosphere of vulnerability, encouragement, and mutual support.

Some participants have since shared these letters with their fathers, while others continue to pray for the courage to begin difficult but necessary conversations. We remain encouraged by the openness demonstrated during the event and continue praying that these acts of honesty will become the beginning of lasting healing, forgiveness, reconciliation, and stronger intergenerational relationships.



Scripture Union Leaders Conference – Kampala Chapter

Our Team Leader served as the Theme Expositor at the Scripture Union Leaders Conference held at Kitante High School, Kampala. Drawing from 2 Timothy 2-2:1, he expounded on the conference theme, **Empowered to Transform**.

The teaching challenged student leaders to recognize that lasting transformation begins with faithful discipleship. Participants were encouraged to remain grounded in Scripture, cultivate spiritual maturity, and intentionally invest in raising the next generation of faithful Christian leaders. The session reinforced the biblical principle that leadership is not merely about influence but about faithfully entrusting God’s truth to others who will continue the work of discipleship.

Uganda Christian Lawyers Fraternity – Law Students’ Moot Court Competition

Our Team Leader participated in the Uganda Christian Lawyers Fraternity’s Law Students’ Moot Court Competition, which focused on **Labour Law**.

This event provided a valuable platform to engage with aspiring legal professionals as they developed practical legal reasoning and advocacy skills. It also demonstrated the importance of integrating Christian ethics and biblical principles into legal practice and public service, encouraging future lawyers to pursue justice with integrity and wisdom.



Fellowship of Christian University Students (FOCUS) Leaders Camp

We had the privilege of ministering at the **Fellowship of Christian University Students (FOCUS) Leaders Camp**, which brought together student leaders from universities across the country for spiritual formation and leadership development.

Our Team Leader facilitated a Bible Lab on Hermeneutics, focusing on Understanding Context, Genre, and Authorial Intent in Scripture. The session equipped participants with practical tools for interpreting the Bible faithfully and responsibly, helping them move beyond surface-level readings to a richer understanding of God's Word.

In addition, our Team Leader served on a **Q&A panel** where students raised thoughtful theological and practical questions relating to Scripture, ministry, discipleship, and Christian living. The discussions provided an important opportunity to encourage young leaders to think biblically and engage contemporary challenges with wisdom and confidence.



Do You Believe?» Fatherhood Journey

Our monthly **Do You Believe? Fatherhood Journey** continued to grow as an intentional discipleship and mentorship platform for young fathers. The programme currently has twelve enrolled participants who meet regularly for theological study, biblical reflection, and mutual encouragement.

Throughout the quarter, participants continued studying **Paul David Tripp's Do You Believe?**, working through foundational Christian doctrines including the authority of Scripture, the doctrine of God, the holiness of God, and God's sovereignty. Each session intentionally connected these theological truths to everyday life, encouraging participants to apply biblical doctrine within their homes, marriages, parenting, work, and personal discipleship.

The discussions have fostered meaningful accountability among the participants while equipping them to lead their families with greater theological depth and spiritual maturity. Our next gathering, **scheduled for 4 July**, will focus on God's omnipotence and its practical implications for everyday Christian living.

Living Word Uganda - Word Work Conference

Our Team Leader also participated in the **Word Work Conference**, organised by our ministry partner, Living Word Uganda.

The conference gathered nearly one hundred pastors representing multiple denominations from five different countries for intensive training in biblical preaching and teaching.

The sessions focused on equipping pastors to faithfully handle Scripture, prepare biblically sound and Christ-centred sermons, and train others to do the same. The conference served as an important investment in strengthening expository preaching and promoting healthy, Scripture-saturated churches throughout the region.



Theological Educators and Trainers' Conference - Nairobi, Kenya

Our Team Leader participated in the Theological Educators and Trainers' Conference, jointly organised by the Oxford Centre for Religion and Public Life (OCRPL), The Shepherds Academy, and Pan Africanist Christian University.

Held at the **KCB Leadership Centre in Karen, Nairobi, Kenya, from 9-6 May 2026**, the conference brought together twenty-eight (28) theologians, scholars, church leaders, ministry practitioners, and institutional representatives from East, West, Central, and Southern Africa.

The conference focused on evaluating the current state of theological education across the continent and collaboratively developing strategies for strengthening theological institutions and equipping grassroots church leadership under the theme: **Theological Education for Transforming Africa and Developing Grassroots Church Leadership**.

Our Team Leader presented a paper titled **Identifying the Gaps and Needs in Theological Education and Research in Africa**. The presentation highlighted key challenges facing theological education, explored opportunities for strengthening biblical training, and contributed to broader discussions on developing contextually faithful and academically rigorous theological institutions across Africa. public life.



MEDIA MINISTRY AND DIGITAL ENGAGEMENT

This quarter marked a particularly fruitful season for our media ministry as we continued to leverage digital platforms to provide biblically grounded teaching and engage contemporary questions of faith, theology, and everyday Christian living.

Through long-form YouTube content, short-form videos, and weekly online discussions, we sought to make sound biblical teaching more accessible while equipping believers to think critically and live faithfully.



During the quarter, we produced and published several YouTube episodes addressing pressing theological, cultural, and practical issues. Each episode was designed to encourage thoughtful engagement with Scripture while responding to questions commonly encountered within the Church and the wider society.

Have Married People Lied About Marriage?

This episode explored common misconceptions about marriage and examined the expectations many people bring into marriage. We discussed whether these expectations are shaped more by cultural narratives and selective testimonies than by the biblical picture of marriage, encouraging viewers to pursue a realistic and Christ-centred understanding of the covenant of marriage.

Send Back to Sender: Biblical Warfare or Syncretism?

We examined the growing popularity of «send back to sender» prayers and considered whether such practices are rooted in biblical teaching or influenced by syncretistic beliefs. The discussion explored the biblical understanding of spiritual warfare, the Christian's response to opposition, and how Christ's command to love our enemies shapes our prayers and conduct.

Does the Holy Spirit Replace the Need for Theological Training?

This episode addressed the relationship between the work of the Holy Spirit and theological education. We demonstrated that while the Holy Spirit illuminates God's Word and empowers believers, Scripture consistently affirms the value of diligent study, faithful teaching, and intentional training for those entrusted with ministry.

Baptism and Re-baptism: Are You Sure You Are Baptised?

We explored the biblical doctrine of baptism by examining its meaning, purpose, and proper administration. The conversation considered common questions surrounding re-baptism and encouraged viewers to evaluate their understanding and practice in light of Scripture.

Who Is God? Who Created Him?

In this episode, we addressed one of the most frequently asked theological questions by exploring God's eternal nature, self-existence, and sovereignty. The discussion helped viewers understand the biblical teaching that God is the uncreated Creator, existing eternally and independently of all creation.



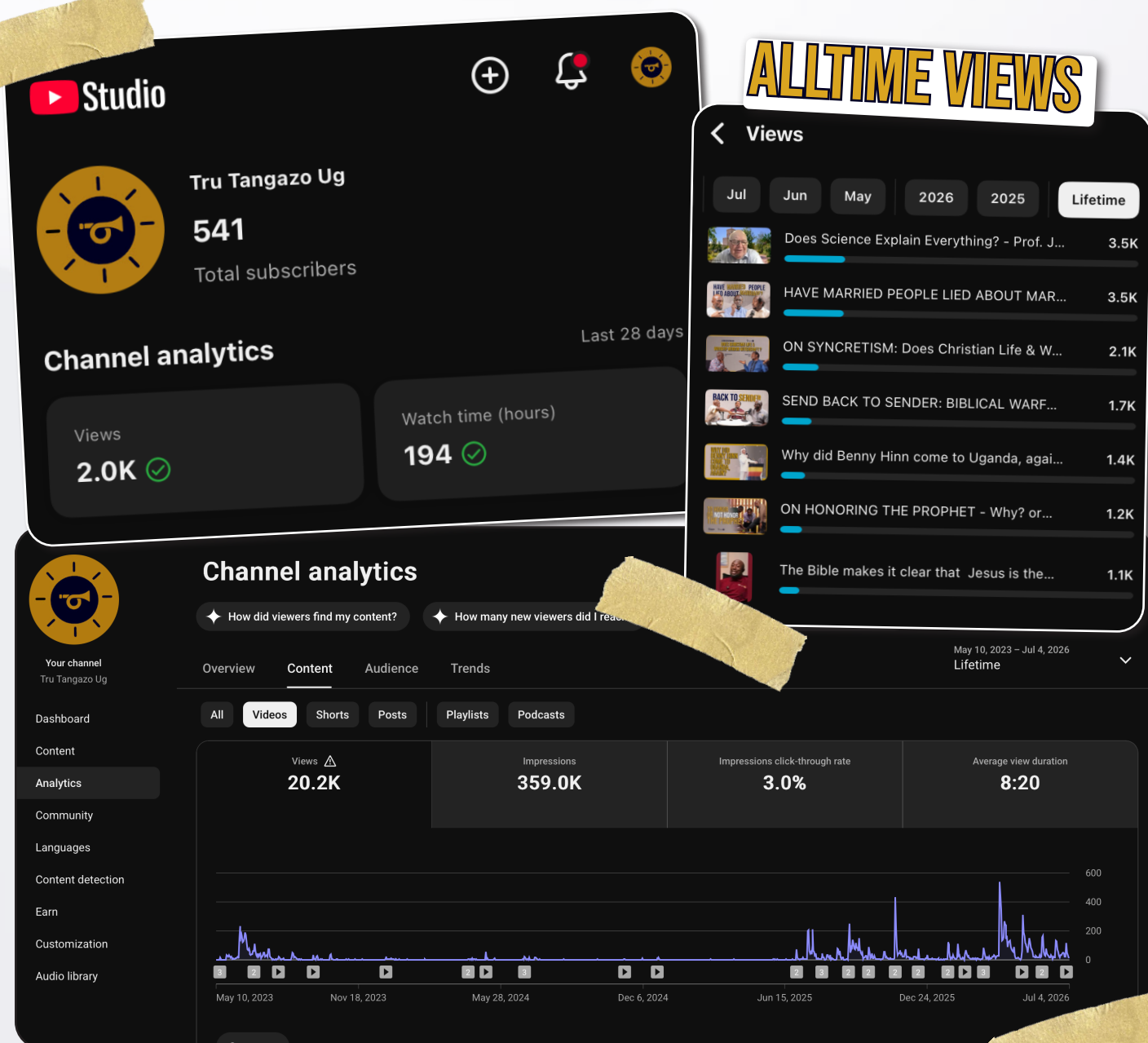
Short-form Digital Content

Alongside our long-form teaching, we continued producing short-form videos for Instagram Reels and YouTube Shorts. These concise, accessible videos highlighted key biblical truths, answered frequently asked theological questions, and provided practical encouragement for everyday Christian living. The short-form content enabled us to reach wider audiences and engage viewers who prefer brief, easily shareable teaching.

Ongoing Digital Ministry

Overall, this quarter was highly productive for our media ministry. We successfully expanded our library of biblical resources while continuing to address relevant cultural and theological issues through thoughtful, Scripture-centred content. We remain encouraged by the opportunities digital media provides to reach audiences beyond our physical gatherings and are committed to producing even more faithful, engaging, and impactful content throughout the remainder of the year.

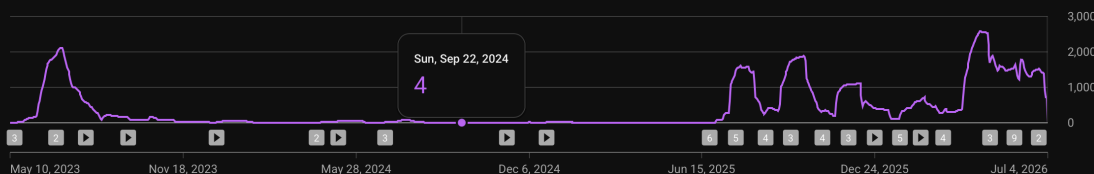
